


To help anyone who needs help with full respect to their race, colour, creed, language, culture and religion.

2017 was an eventful year for Thye Hua Kwan Moral Society. THKMS celebrated our 39 years of history and launched a new logo for one of our iconic events known as the Inter Racial Inter Religious Harmony Nite. The logo takes the form of a dove that represents peace and harmony.

In light of the global unrest and religious conflict that is increasingly prevalent in the world today, it is ever more important that Singapore's self-made asset of racial and religious harmony permeate among our people and is passed on to future generations. The Inter Racial Inter Religious Harmony Nite continues to adopt a youthcentric approach through strategic partnerships with the National Youth Council to emphasise the message of racial harmony among youths.

CHAIRMAN'S Message

The Thye Hua Kwan Temple at Fernvale Link is currently under construction. The Chinese temple aims to be more than just a place of worship for the Chinese but a place where people of different faiths come together to learn about different religious beliefs and practices through various talks and programmes.

The Temple will have a library of Religious Books from the various faiths. It will also have a Hall of Filial Piety where members of the public can place a tablet for their ancestors or relatives, but they will have to place a video on the lifetimes of their deceased parents. It is our wish that the children or grandchildren will remember their forefathers by watching the video.

Thye Hua Kwan continues to provide services to respond to the needs of the community. In the third quarter of 2017, Thye Hua Kwan Moral Society was reappointed as the managing agent of both the Moral Welfare Home and the Angsana Home @ Pelangi Village for a term of 3 years starting from 2018 to 2021.

THK Child Care Centres were also novated and rebranded as Super Talent Childcare Ltd. The second phase of the building expansion for Ang Mo Kio-Thye Hua Kwan Hospital was completed in 2017. New infrastructure and amenities were added to facilitate the expansion of services. Thye Hua Kwan Moral Charities also set up the THK Autism Centre @ Geylang Bahru to serve adults with Autism Spectrum Disorder.

THK Medical Services serve anyone who needs help within the community. THK Free Clinic (Western Medical) also welcomes migrant workers in need to seek medical consultation.

All of these would not have been possible without the support of the community stakeholders such as ministries, government agencies, corporate companies, donors and volunteers. We are grateful for the support as we continue to work together to serve those who need help with full respect to their race, colour, creed, language, culture and religion.

President's idea led to scheme helping those with disabilities

They can now join activities at some of THK Moral Charities' senior centres in lull periods

The germ of an idea came from President Halimah Yacob several years ago when she was a minister of state.

Yesterday, she visited a charity that had brought it to fruition by opening up some of its eldercare centres to people with disabilities after mealtimes, when the crowds of seniors have dwindled. These centres allow those with dis-abilities to take part in social and recreational programmes in the community, so they will not be cooped up at home. At the same time, caregivers get a respite. The fa-cilities are offered for free, for a few hours a day, up to three days a week.

It was why she had discussed with Mr Lee if people with disabili-ties who are not at school or work could use the centres during the lull periods. Madam Haliwah

periods. Madam Halimah commended THK Moral Charities for its work and said it was a "major player in the social service sector". It runs more than 60 programmes, two homes and 55 centres for differ-ent disadvantaged groups. "THK Indus Moral Care has been around for 17 years... I see the senior

"THK Indus Moral Care nas been around for Tyears... Isee the senior citizens here with happy faces, which means they find the activi-ties you provide meaningful," she said. "We want our senior citizens to be independent and supported by

their families, but also to have com-munity support which is accessible to them." The centre serves 380 senior citi-zens living in Block 79, Indus Road - where it is sited – as well as nearby blocks. Mr Leong Tuck Soon, 93, who goes regularly to the centre, said he enjoyed speaking to Madam Hal-imah. "We spoke in Malay. She is some-

enjoyed speaking to Madam Hal-imah. "We spoke in Malay. She is some-one who is understanding and con-cerned about people's welfare." Since she was sworn in as head of state on Sept 14, Madam Halimah has visited a centre run by the Asso-ciation for Persons with Special Needs that prepares people with disabilities for employment, and the National University Hospital to ese how its healthcare workers are coping with the demands of Singa-pore's ageing population.





THK CHILD CARE CENTRES

Thye Hua Kwan Moral Society's Child Care Centres worked closely with Early Childhood Development Agency (ECDA) to implement the Partner Operator (POP) Scheme since January 2016. The 4 THK Child Care Centres under the POP Scheme have grown significantly. The centres continually enhance the learning environment for the children by adding in new infrastructure and equipment while integrating meaningful experiences in their learning process.

Thye Hua Kwan Moral Society also embarked on novation plans for the 4 Child Care Centres. THK Child Care Centres will be novated to Super Talent Childcare Limited with effect from 2018. In 2018, the following centres will be renamed as:

Super Talent Childcare (Ang Mo Kio) – previously known as THK Educare Centre @ Ang Mo Kio Super Talent Childcare (Membina) – previously known as THK Child Development Centre @ Membina

Super Talent Childcare (MacPherson 93) – previously known as THK Child Care Centre @ MacPherson

Super Talent Childcare (MacPherson 122) – previously known as THK Child Development Centre @ MacPherson

THK STUDENT CARE CENTRES

Thye Hua Kwan Moral Society runs 3 Student Care Centres to provide care and supervision to school-going children aged 7 years (Primary 1) to 14 years (Secondary 2). THK Student Care Centres provide a conducive environment for the children's holistic development and provides support in areas such as homework supervision, organised play, enrichment and recreational activities.



THKMS WELFARE SERVICES ANGSANA HOME @ PELANGI VILLAGE

Angsana Home @ Pelangi Village is a gazetted Welfare Home under the Destitute Persons Act. The Home renders care and rehabilitation to destitute persons. It also operates an intake centre. The Home can accommodate 180 main home residents and 20 intake centre residents.

Thye Hua Kwan Moral Society successfully recontracted the managing agent rights for Angsana Home @ Pelangi Village in the last quarter of 2017 to run the Home for the next 3 years. The model of care at the Home involves holistic assessment of our residents' needs, fostering individual care plans and interim goals, and empowering the residents with support and services. Our multidisciplinary team comprises nursing, operations, programme, case management and administration staff coming together as an integrated unit to ensure timely support and quality care.

In 2017, the Home fostered strategic partnerships with various community agencies such as WeCare Community Services, AWARE Singapore, New Hope Community Services, National Addictions Management Service (NAMS), ISCOS, and Alcoholics Anonymous. The established network will help to complement rehabilitation, reintegration and post-discharge efforts for the residents.

To better support the residents in coping and managing their substance addiction relapses, the Home also worked with National Addictions Management Services (NAMS) to tailor programmes focused on psychotherapies, psychoeducation and support groups for both staff and residents. The programmes are expected to begin in 2018.

The Sheltered Workshop continued to maintain strong ties with our existing partners such as Festive Pack, Unipress and Unigrow to secure contract work so as to ensure that the residents are meaningfully engaged.

STRATEGIC PLANNING

The Home has embarked on strategic planning for the Home's infrastructure such as information technology systems, security enhancement, effective space planning of the premises, as well as staff development in areas such as service delivery, professionalism and overall competencies. The "Angsana Future Ready Masterplan" will be executed in 3 phases, spanning over 2018 to 2019.

THKMS WELFARE SERVICES MORAL WELFARE HOME

Moral Welfare Home is a gazetted welfare home by the Ministry of Social and Family Development. Thye Hua Kwan Moral Society is the managing agent for the Ministry and helps to administer care, reception and rehabilitation of destitute persons. 80% of the residents are intellectually disabled and all of them are diagnosed with multiple disabilities.

COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIPS / VOLUNTEERISM

The Home's Big Day Out 3 was held on 7 September 2017 at Gardens by the Bay with the support of our community partners such as James Cook University and Gardens by the Bay. Volunteers like ST Kinetics, AVTs and the NUS Student's Union Volunteer Action Committee also continued their volunteer efforts with the Home.

PROGRAMMES AND INITIATIVES

Playeum collaborated with the Home to set up a multi-sensory integration room. Residents get to express themselves through play and through engaging their senses, helps them feel more at ease. The Home also conducts mass aerobics workout for the residents twice a day to ensure that they get regular exercise.

THKMS SUBSIDIARIES ANG MO KIO - THYE HUA KWAN HOSPITAL

Ang Mo Kio – Thye Hua Kwan Hospital (AMKH) is a 360-bedded step-down care facility that is primarily focused on rehabilitative care. The Hospital also provides sub-acute care, dementia care as well as pre-terminal palliative care for our patients. The aim is to help patients achieve independence and integration into the community.

PROGRAMMES AND INITIATIVES

The Hospital makes continuous effort to provide seamless care for patients by identifying service gaps, as well as to empower the community through training programmes.

In 2017, the Palliative Care Unit was introduced to care for pre-terminally ill patients. In addition, over 150 nurses underwent training for skills upgrading so as to provide optimal care for patients requiring Peritoneal Dialysis (PD) under the Continuous Peritoneal Dialysis programme.

HOSPITAL EXPANSION

The Hospital began its two-phased building expansion project in 2014 to cater to the nation's increasing demand for community hospital services. In 2017, the completion of the second phase saw the construction of a new six-storey administration block, a fourstorey Annex block and the expansion of the carpark's capacity from 90 to 120 parking lots, equipped with a fully-automated electronic parking system. 10 new isolation rooms and a 170 square metre gym and rehabilitation space have also been added.

THYE HUA KWAN NURSING HOME @ HOUGANG

THK Nursing Home @ Hougang was established since 3 October 2016 to provide quality nursing care for up to 285 seniors, including 114 beds for those with dementia. The nursing home provides a person-centred and safe environment to facilitate aging in the community.

PROGRAMMES AND INITIATIVES

A series of programmes and community partnerships are in place to keep the residents engaged and actively stimulated to counter the four major problems of loneliness, boredom, despair and isolation that is a common problem for many seniors staying in residential care.

Regular engagement programmes have been established with various schools within the vicinity, such as Montfort School, Bedok Green Secondary School and PCF Sparkletots @ Hougang. Students from these schools held regular performances and engagement sessions with the residents.

THK Nursing Home @ Hougang also partnered the Institute of Mental Health to participate in the Common Video Consultation Platform Project, initiated as part of the Telehealth Projects by Integrated Health Information Systems Pte Ltd (IHiS). Video consultation services allowed the residents to receive teletreatment remotely with doctors at Institute of Mental Health (IMH).

THKNH HOME CARE SERVICES

Thye Hua Kwan Nursing Home Limited began providing Home Care Services since April 2017 to serve clients who are not suitable for centre-based services. Home Care Services help to support frail and homebound clients in areas such as personal hygiene, housekeeping and mind-stimulation activities. • Home Medical & Nursing programme serves clients who require medical or nursing care due to various chronic conditions or terminal illnesses.

• Home Personal Care Services provide help in medication care, personal hygiene, mindstimulation activities, simple prescribed exercises, elder-sitting and caregiver respite, as well as running simple errands.

• Interim Care Services provides assistance in nutrition and feeding, wound care, respiratory care, tube / catheter care and stoma care.

THK SENIOR CARE CENTRE @ KAKI BUKIT (BEDOK NORTH)

THK Senior Care Centre @ Kaki Bukit began operations in late November 2016 to add on to THK Nursing Home Limited's eldercare services for the Intermediate Long Term Care sector. The Centre aims to care for around 80 seniors during the day as it offers a range of step-down care services to provide a conducive and engaging environment for the elderly clients to stay active while receiving medical care.

PROGRAMMES

Maintenance Day Care & Centre-Based Nursing

The Maintenance Day Care Centre serves elderly clients who are frail or physically disabled. Programmes and activities run by our therapists allow them to maintain or improve their general, physical and social well-being. The programme also serves elderly who require nursing care for wound-related problems and provides respite and support for caregivers who require assistance in caring for their loved ones.

Dementia Day Care Centre

The Dementia Day Care Centre serves elderly clients who are diagnosed with dementia and living in the community. The centre-based monitoring provides support and assistance with their daily activities that will help to slow down the deterioration process of their physical and mental functions, so as to maintain their general and social well-being. Similarly, caregiver support is also given to caregivers who require respite or support in caring for their loved ones.
