

Super Talent Childcare (Membina) children embarked on a journey themed "Kindness" for their SSDB Project in 2021.

Stories that introduced the importance of kindness were taught to the children; they were also encouraged to share what they learnt and re-enact different scenarios using puppets to make learning enjoyable.

Some takeaways include learning to say "Please" when asking for help, "Thank You" when someone helps, and "Sorry" when they hurt someone accidentally.

Our children honed their creativity using oil pastels and different kinds of paper to create kindness clouds that were later used in a show-and-tell. The clouds contained words that exhibited kindness, and children could share the words they chose during the show-and-tell.

THKMS WELFARE SERVICES

THK ANGSANA HOME @ PELANGI VILLAGE

THK Angsana Home @ Pelangi Village is a Welfare Home for the destitute, which currently serves about 216 residents. The Home uses a systematic and structured approach to serve the residents by maximizing the individual's strength and potential with the aim of reintegration into the community.

2021 - A year where new normality was put in place by the COVID pandemic.

The pandemic continues to place restriction for all activities, which disrupts the daily lives of residents. While the residents adapt to the safety measures and lockdown, they also must adjust to the limited social freedom. This has further restricted their sense of autonomy and movements within **THK** Angsana Home and the community. To ease their challenges and encourage resilience during the pandemic, the Home innovated measures to reduce the residents' discomfort and meet their essential needs. It increased its welfare distribution programmes, virtual tours and volunteer-led programmes.

The Home also increased resident engagements to occupy them meaningfully. These include movie screenings, faith-based programmes, low-intensity sports activities, art sessions and more. As external employment was not an option, the Home introduced more Home Earning Schemes for the residents to participate in.

PARTNERSHIP WITH YIO CHU KANG CHAPEL (YCK)

YCK continued to provide spiritual support to the residents by conducting church mass/bible study through zoom conference. This was instrumental for the residents' spiritual well-being while they practiced their faith. YCK also generously donated special meal treats and goodie bags on various occasions during festive periods. This was important as it would uplift their mood and help them feel valued.

WELFARE PACK DISTRIBUTION

The lockdown prevented our home residents from purchasing their usual monthly groceries. Thus, this led to limiting their esteem needs in having the autonomy for the routine purchases, which may be easily taken for granted for those of us living in the community. In view of this, **THK** Angsana Home prepared welfare packs which consisted of grocery items that were selected by the residents and distributed the packs to them on a monthly basis.

VIRTUAL TOURS

Outdoor trips were suspended due to the safe management measures. However, **THK** Angsana Home adapted and brought residents on virtual trips. In partnership with Singapore Association for Mental Health (SAMH) and external vendors, residents were able to learn about the history of "popiah" in a safe environment.

Residents learnt about the history of popiah. They gained deeper appreciation of how it originated, and the ingredients involved in the process of making a popiah. This virtual session was conducted by Kway Guan Huat Joo Chiat Popiah.

CASE MANGEMENT

Casework Statistics

Despite the restrictions of the pandemic, the Case Management team continues to uphold high standards in service deliveries. They received 23 new admissions and successfully reintegrated 13 residents back into the community.

IMPORTANT HIGHLIGHTS

Managing the residents under such constrained circumstances was also an uphill task. Despite that, the team continued to innovate new approaches to circumvent challenges and restrictions imposed by the pandemic.

Firstly, the team in collaboration with the nursing and operations department, improved communication channels to provide immediate resolutions to the resident's concerns, and to uphold safety for our residents.

Secondly, in collaboration with Ministry of Social and Family Development (MSF), the team innovated its discharge progress formulation and recreated a different model of approach as seen in Figure 1.

Resident's Addiction Management

In 2021, members of the Board of Visitors (BOV) continued to provide occasional visits despite the pandemic. These visits are important to ensure that quality service is upheld, and it is a valuable means to obtain important feedback to identify gaps and enhance our best practices. BOV's members generally made observations about the Home's environment, case management, programmes and resident's wellbeing. Their feedback thus far has been positive.

Improvement of Practices

Operations has adopted the use of SoundEye technologies. This provides real time non-intrusive monitoring of residents who may be in distress. This allows our duty officers to respond to any crisis quickly and accurately.

Operational Effectiveness

The following practices were adopted for effectiveness and efficiency in daily operations:

1. Improved communications with other departments to maintain a one voice, one direction approach. This is to ensure consistency, accountability, and information sharing.

2. Continued communications with various stakeholders to understand and address their concerns in a timely and constructive manner.

3. To review and refine operational procedures regularly.

Operations During the Pandemic

1. Operations worked closely with nursing, duty officers and HA staff to ensure that COVID Safe Management Measures (SMM) are carried out and upheld the hygiene standards in the Home. 2. Duty officers also went the extra mile by providing emotional support to residents who were experiencing difficulties coping with the restrictions imposed by the SMM. This included simple gestures like offering a listening ear and checking in on them.

THKMS WELFARE SERVICES

THK MORAL WELFARE HOME

THK Moral Welfare Home is a Ministry of Social and Family Development (MSF) gazette Home, managed by Thye Hua Kwan Moral Society. The Home is a purpose-built facility that cares for the destitute suffering from multiple disabilities. About 80% of the residents are intellectually disabled. The Home provides holistic care in an institutional environment that empowers residents to lead meaningful lives.

Moral Welfare Home is guided by the principles of Residential Rehabilitation:

- 1. Provide care with the aim of reintegration back into society
- 2. Develop and foster a safe and supportive environment for rehabilitation
- 3. Maximizing the strengths and potential of each resident
- 4. Strengthening the familial relationship between residents and their kin
- 5. Fostering partnerships with community resources

COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIP / VOLUNTEERISM

Into its 7th year, the annual "Big Day Out", which is jointly organised by the Home and James Cook University, continued to be conducted remotely in December 2021 due to COVID-19. The event was aptly named "Big Day In", where student volunteers from James Cook University virtually engaged 50 residents through performance arts, skits, and presentations.

Be Kind SG, supported by Central Singapore CDC, provides monthly engagement for the residents of the Home though hosting virtual activities such as magic shows, games, workshops, and meal donations. Due to prevailing Safe Management Measures, the activities were only limited to 10 participants each session, and the Home assisted with rotating the participants to increase their scope of engagement.

These meal centres are unfunded and are operating on donations and fund raising efforts.

THKMS offers medical services for the community by running several free Traditional Chinese Medicine (TCM) clinics, namely the **THK** TCM Medical Clinic located at Ang Mo Kio, and Taman Jurong.

The **THK** TCM Medical Centre (Taman Jurong) opens twice a week and had 1,981 patient visits in 2019.

Allied Health Staff participated and contributed to various taskforce set up by MOH and MSF in the areas of Community rehab transformation, Entrustable Therapy Task, One Rehab, and IDDISI Framework to provide common terminology for food and texture. The task force were set up to look into ways to enhance elderly services across Singapore.

Ang Mo Kio - Thye Hua Kwan Hospital also identified key training gaps in clinical skills for seniors and worked with L&D department to help enhance skills with appropriate training. Worked with Volunteer Management team to participate in various competition and showcase the excellent work in key areas. We also helped senior clinicians to develop improved standards of clinical practice with clinical and administrative quidelines for improved department performance.

An Award Presentation Ceremony was held on 10 February 2022. CEO and Heads of Department graced the presentation ceremony.

The Nurses' Merit Award is awarded by the Ministry of Health to nurses who have demonstrated consistent and outstanding performance, participated in professional development, and have made contributions to promote the nursing profession.

Ms Siti Rohaidah Binte Mohamed from our Nursing Services Department was one of the 125 recipients of this award that was presented in a virtual award ceremony on 7 July 2021.

Launched in 2011, the Singapore Health Quality Service Awards (SHQSA) is a nationwide platform that honours healthcare professionals who have demonstrated remarkable commitment in delivering quality care and excellent service. For the year 2021, staff from Ang Mo Kio - Thye Hua Kwan Hospital won 84 Silver, 68 Gold, 68 Star and 1 Super Star awards.

GAME CHANGER - DAY REHABILITATION CENTRE

Staff attended the Community Care Development Award, together with the CEO and Heads of Department



Rehabilitation services at our DRC forms a critical component of the care pathway helping patients through improving independence and community reintegration. The impact of the COVID-19 pandemic was disruptive on rehabilitation systems and journey for patients. Rehabilitation services were ceased or modified to adhere to social distancing measures and reduce cross-infection. The lockdown measures affected daily attendance as patients and families were not keen for coming out to the centre fearing picking up COVID-19 from others. Irrespective of the issues faced, the AMKH-DRC continued to provide rehabilitation services to the patients with dedicated spaces for therapy and clear protocols in place about the required measures, cleaning of rehab equipment as well as limits to the number of patients in the therapy areas at a given time. The DRC practiced triage by condition to ensure that patients in danger of deterioration were placed in high priority for rehabilitation.

A total of 9719 therapy sessions were carried out during the financial year ranging from active to maintenance rehabilitation.

The centre introduced dedicated transport service for patients who stay in Ang Mo Kio, Yishun, Upper Thompson and Bishan. The service was well received and plans are underway to expand it to other geographical areas.

The DRC stepped forward to assist AIC and MOH in National Vaccination exercise and arranged mobile vaccination team to provide Covid19 vaccine to DRC clients. Around 200 patients were vaccinated at the centre.

AMKH-DRC continues to take part in research activities to improve services. DRC was closely involved in projects like MOH Community Rehabilitation Transformation Workshop; home-based robot-assisted hand rehabilitation for individuals with Chronic Stroke; and Understanding physical activity, sleep and social interaction patterns after stroke.

THKNH comprises of three business units such as Nursing Home, Senior Care Centre & Home Care Services.

THKNH INSTITUTIONAL CARE

Thye Hua Kwan Nursing Home @ Hougang is purpose-built by MOH to serve up to 285 patients. Of which, **THK**NH serves 114 dementia patients, which forms close to 50% of the resident population. To achieve that, the Nursing Home holistically considers all psychosocial, physical, medical and emotional aspects of our clients and create a conducive, person-centered and safe environment for them.
